"Anyone who has had Bible stories read to him as a child knows that there are great stories in the bible. But it is possible to know Bible stories, yet miss *the* Bible story. The Bible is much more than a 'golden casket where gems of truth are stored.' It is more than a bewildering collection of oracles, proverbs, poems, architectural directions, annals, and prophecies. The Bible has a story line. It traces an unfolding drama....The story is God's story. It describes His work to rescue rebels from their folly, guilt, and ruin....Here at last is the culmination of the long story of the suffering of the servants of God. Moses endured the reproach of Israel. Elijah fled for his life. Jeremiah was cast into a pit. But Isaiah describes One who is more than a prophet. Like them, He is persecuted, but unlike them, He is sinless. David too, bore reproach for the sake of the Lord, but David brought shame on his rule by his own sin. The Lord delivered him and restored his throne, but David was never exalted to God's right hand. The priests offered daily sacrifices, but the Servant offers Himself as the sin offering. The anointing of the Servant is to accomplish God's salvation to the ends of the earth."

Gospel Lesson

Ephesians 6 "The Armor of God"

¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. ¹² For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; ¹⁷ and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, ¹⁸ praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints, ¹⁹ and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains, that I may declare it boldly, as I ought to speak."

Receiving the Word of God

Sermon: Romans 1:2

"The Gospel in the Old Testament"

(If able, please stand for the reading of God's word) Rev. Justin Westmoreland

1 Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, ² which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy Scriptures, ³ concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh ⁴ and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, ⁵ through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of his name among all the nations, ⁶ including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ,

⁷ To all those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Minister: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God!

Big Point: How does one account for the existence of the biblical prophets? An adequate understanding of the Gospel of God being rooted in the message of the Old Testament prophets gives us confidence in our salvation and sufficient reason to have urgency in our proclamation of it.
