<u>Question ONE</u>: What is necessary that one may be saved from the guilt, power, and penalty of sin?

<u>Question TWO</u>: What clues from Genesis 1-3 do you see that point us to the gospel that the creator must somehow die and be raised?

<u>Question THREE</u>: How does Genesis 22 and the crossing of the Red Sea/Exodus point to the gospel that the creator must die and be raised?

<u>Question FOUR</u>: How do Peter's words in Acts 3 about the death and resurrection of Jesus bring fuller meaning to Daniel's story and prophecy?

Question FIVE: How does the resurrection of the creator connect that it was not good that man was alone in Genesis 2, the suffering of the husband and wife of Song of Solomon due to their separation, and the forsakenness of Jesus from the cross crying, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

#### Resurrection Lesson- John 20:1-10 "That He Must Rise from the Dead"

Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. 2 So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." 3 So Peter went out with the other disciple, and they were going toward the tomb. 4 Both of them were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. 5 And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. 6 Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there, 7 and the face cloth, which had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself. 8 Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; 9 for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead. 10 Then the disciples went back to their homes.

Public Confession of Sin from Proverbs 1:7; Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21. Heavenly Father, your word teaches that wise men seek after wisdom and conclude that wisdom begins and ends in the fear and pursuit of You.

We grieve that we were born dead to your truth in our hearts and determined in our will to pursue the folly of revolt from your standards. We exhibit this folly in our irrational paradox: we arrogantly boast before the world while guilt and shame-ridden hiding from your presence. This duplicity stores up your justifiable wrath. We name this inheritance from Adam, our own complicity in it, and the wrath it causes as it truly is: sin. We have joined the world in sinfully despising your Son. Yet while we were unlovable and still dead in our sins, you sent the Son to become sin for us that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.

We confess that for the sake of sinners, Jesus was born to become the Man of Sorrows, afflicted and bruised, crucified, and descend to our hell.... 3 We confess that we still sin, but that we are justified by faith. By your grace and Spirit, Jesus rose on the third day for our justification. The cross was our judgment day and the resurrection of the Son our justification. May we never again fear your gaze because of the grace we have in you. May you become more and more precious to us.

As we saw Peter and John transformed through their discovery of the empty tomb and communion with you in your resurrected life, may we leave our sinful pursuits behind considering them loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing you. We pray in the name of Christ who rose from the dead. Amen.

#### **Private Confession of Sin**

Words of Assurance Romans 10:5-10

5 For Moses writes about the righteousness that is based on the law, that the person who does the commandments shall live by them. 6 But the righteousness based on faith says, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) 7 "or 'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). 8 But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); 9 because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved."

# Resurrection Sermon 1 of 2: Acts 3:11-17 "Resurrection of the Creator" The Resurrection of Christ Proclaimed in the Old Testament

(If able, please stand for the reading of God's word.) Rev. Justin Westmoreland

11 While he clung to Peter and John, all the people, utterly astounded, ran together to them in the portico called Solomon's. 12 And when Peter saw it he addressed the people: "Men of Israel, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we have made him walk? 13 The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, glorified his servant Jesus, whom you delivered over and denied in the presence of Pilate, when he had decided to release him. 14 But you denied the Holy and Righteous One, and asked for a murderer to be granted to you, 15 and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. 16 And his name—by faith in his name—has made this man strong whom you see and know, and the faith that is through Jesus has given the man this perfect health in the presence of you all.

Minister: This is the Word of the Lord.

## People: Thanks be to God!

<u>Main Idea</u>: Through this inspired proclamation by Peter, we will see how salvation is by the resurrection of the creator/author of life.

- I. The God of Genesis who created the universe and Israel must be resurrected- Creator united to creation to destroy the thing that He did not create: sin.
- II. The God of Daniel must be resurrected because as King of Kings his resurrection would complete the humiliation of Pharoah, Nebuchadnezzar, lions, Pilate, Caiaphas, death, etc.
- The God of the Song of Solomon must be resurrected in order to bring reconciliation from the alienation experienced by the Loving Son from His Loving Father in his descent into hell for sinners.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>54</sup> When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory." <sup>5</sup> "O death, where is your victory?
