¹⁷ Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. - Hebrews 2:17

"When Paul explains the gospel in Romans, he states that God, in providing redemption through the cross of Christ, demonstrates both that He is just and the justifier of those who have faith (Rom 3:26). The cross is the clearest expression of God's grace and mercy that we find anywhere in Scripture. There are those who say they prefer the God of the New Testament because he is a God of love, grace, and mercy, while the Old Testament God is vengeful, angry, and concerned about law and justice. It is important to note in response that the most vivid demonstration of the wrath and justice of god we find in Scripture is found in the New Testament, at the cross. In the violence of that act, the wrath of God was poured out on One who, in and of Himself, was completely innocent but who took upon Himself our transgressions and our guilt."

That we may know the holy nature and will of God, and the sinful nature and disobedience of our hearts; and thus our need of a Savior. The law also teaches and exhorts us to live a life worthy of our Savior.

"For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin."- Romans 3:20

Receiving the Word of God

Sermon: Romans 3:25-26

"The Vindication of God"

(If able, please stand for the reading of God's word.) Rev. Justin Westmoreland

21 But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—22 the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, 25 whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. 26 It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

Minister: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God!

In v25-26, Paul continues to explain what "justification" is. Justification puts God in an awkward, apparent tension of being unjust in which God can only be vindicated if Jesus was, in fact, offered as a propitiation sacrifice. A vindicated God is a God who is worthy of our worship and our full devotion.

- I. Justification is received by faith alone.
- II. But this does not answer God's personal anger/wrath against sin.
- III. Unless Jesus functioned as a propitiatory sacrifice
- IV. Then God is both just and justifier of the one who has faith.
