Confession of Faith Heidelberg Catechism Q&A #54-56

Q. What do you believe concerning ‘the holy catholic church’?
A. I believe that the Son of God through his Spirit and word, out of the entire human race, from the beginning of the world to its end, gathers, protects, and preserves for himself a community chosen for eternal life and united in true faith. And of this community I am and always will be a living member.

Q. What do you understand by the communion of the saints?
All: First, that believers, all and everyone, as members of Christ have communion with him and share in all his treasures and gifts. Second, that everyone is duty-bound to use their gifts readily and cheerfully for the benefit and well-being of the other members.

Q. What do you believe concerning the forgiveness of sins?

31 He put another parable before them, saying, "The kingdom of heaven is like a grain of mustard seed that a man took and sowed in his field. 32 It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is larger than all the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches."
