Avenues for Giving:

Definition of A Communicant Member:

A communicant church member is one who has made public his profession of faith in Jesus Christ, who has been baptized, and who has submitted to Christ's Lordship and to the authority of the Church. The communicant member is entitled to all the rights and privileges of the congregation, including:

- A. Voting in congregational meetings.
- B. Holding office if qualified according to Scripture
- C. Participating in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.
- D. Presenting his children for the Sacrament of Baptism

Responsibility of a Church Member:

Church members are required to:

- A. Diligently use of the means of grace (scripture/worship/prayer/fellowship).
- B. Faithfully participate in the worship and service of the Church.
- C. Give of their substance as the Lord may prosper them.
- D. Wholeheartedly serve Christ and His Kingdom throughout the world.
- E. Continue in the peace and fellowship of the people of God.
- F. Submit to the authority of the elders.
- G. Faithfully bear Gospel witness to family, friends, and all neighbors.

Applicants received by a profession of faith into church membership shall be examined by the Session in private with regard to a knowledge of their spiritual need, their faith in Jesus Christ, and their intention to be obedient to Him.

Membership Questions & Vows for Entering into Solemn Covenant with God: (1) Do you confess that you are a sinner in God's eyes; that you deserve His punishment; that you are unable to save yourself; and that you rely upon God's love and mercy for your only hope of salvation?

(2) Do you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and the Savior of sinners; and do you receive and trust in Him alone for your salvation?

(3) Do you accept the Bible, both Old and New Testaments, as the written Word of God; and that it is the only perfect summary of who God is and how we are to glorify Him?

(4) Do you promise by God's grace and strength of the Holy Spirit so to live all of life as a Christian, following the example set by Jesus Christ?

(5) Do you promise to faithfully use all of the time, treasure, and talents that God has entrusted to you for the furtherance of God's Kingdom?

(6) Do you accept that our church's summaries of doctrine found in the Westminster Confession and Catechisms are founded upon the Scriptures?

(7) Do you submit yourself to the government and discipline of Trinity Presbyterian Church, promising to seek the peace, purity, and prosperity of this church as long as you are a member of it?

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. ⁴ In him was life, and the life was the light of men. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁶ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. ⁸ He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

⁹ The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world.

¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. ¹¹ He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. ¹² But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.
